Will my delivery or hospital-based procedures still take place at St. Mary Medical Center? Patients with services currently scheduled at St. Mary Medical Center will remain as planned; however, we are beginning the process of moving our hospital-based services to nearby Capital Health Medical Center – Hopewell in Pennington, NJ over the next few months. This comes with a level 3 NICU, which allows us to care for our patients who deliver prior to 32 weeks of pregnancy
