The Grant Program, a major initiative of Capital Women in Philanthropy, provides vital funding to enhance Capital Health's existing programs and services and to seed new initiatives.

2021 Grant Highlight

RISE/Second Victim

Members of the Capital Health family working in the Bristol Myers Squibb Trauma Center at Capital Health Regional Medical Center saw the need for a formal peer support program for healthcare workers involved in unanticipated adverse patient events, medical errors, or patient–related injuries. A Capital Women in Philanthropy (CWP) grant request was submitted and approved at the annual CWP member grant review meeting and the RISE/Second Victim program was born!

This program provides 24/7/365 on-call availability of Capital Health staff peer-responder volunteers who are specially trained to assist employees during a time of need. The Second Victim may feel personally responsible for the outcome and that they "failed" the patient often suffering in silence.
