WHEELS OF JOY: VOLUNTEERS ON THE MOVE WITH HOSPITALITY CARTS











The Auxiliary sponsors eight service programs at Capital Health, each aimed at enhancing patient experience and alleviating anxiety.

- Care Packs for Kids: This initiative provides backpacks filled with stuffed animals, blankets and other age-appropriate comfort items to Pediatric Emergency Department patients at Capital Health Medical Center – Hopewell who have been displaced from their homes or are experiencing economic hardship. In 2024, the Auxiliary will extend this support to children participating in our CARES (Children Are Really Extra Special) Child Wellness Program.
- Cookie Program for oncology patients:
 This program offers snacks to patients undergoing chemotherapy and radiation, providing comfort and an energy boost during treatment. In the past year, approximately 6,240+ snacks were provided, with special thanks to the Hopewell Valley Central High School CHATS Club for their \$400 contribution raised during Pennington Day.
- **Toy Closet:** Monthly, our Pediatric Emergency Department and Ambulatory Care Department at Capital Health Medical Center - Hopewell, the Capital Health Family Health Center in Trenton, and the satellite emergency department at Capital Health – East Trenton receive 70 toy packages each to alleviate the anxiety of hospital visits. Additionally, Capital Health OB/GYN – Trenton, the Emergency Department at Capital Health Regional Medical Center, and the satellite emergency department at Deborah in Browns Mills receive toy packages every other month. The Auxiliary's annual Santa's Visit on December 14, 2023, saw the distribution of Star Wars books and more than two hundred holiday gifts to our Family Health Center patients in Trenton, thanks to the support of the Hopewell Valley Central High School CHATS Club and our hospital and Auxiliary volunteers.

- Family Health Clinic and Clothes4Change:
 These programs provide gently used clothing, healthy snacks, and other infant care items to patients and their families at our Family Health Center in Trenton. Over the past year, they have provided 24 pack-and-plays, 12 humidifiers, clothing for newborns up to age six, and healthy snacks.
- Farmers Market: This initiative addresses food insecurity by providing healthy produce and staple items to patients in Trenton. The Auxiliary hosts six Farmers Markets annually from June through September, distributing six hundred bags of farm-fresh produce and pantry items in the summer of 2023. Looking forward to 2024, seven markets are currently planned, with more bags to be distributed per market, including staple items, food tastings, and bilingual healthy recipes, all thanks to Rolling Harvest Food Rescue and our dedicated volunteers.



- Memorial Garden: The Auxiliary sponsors the maintenance of its Memorial Garden, located in the CHAI Garden at Capital Health Medical Center – Hopewell.
- Mobile Library: This program offers activity books, bibles, crosswords, fiction and nonfiction books, and magazines to patients at both hospital campuses. In 2023, the Mobile Library distributed 1,215 books.
- Tales for Tiny Tots: Promoting early literacy, this program provides a keepsake book to every baby born at Capital Health. In 2023, we distributed 3,728 books.

These programs demonstrate the Auxiliary's commitment to supporting the well-being of Capital Health patients and their families through the dedication of volunteers and community partners.



HEALTHY SPRING SALAD

INGREDIENTS

- 1 bunch asparagus, tender parts, chopped into 1-inch pieces
- ½ cup frozen peas, thawed
- A few handfuls of salad greens
- 2 radishes, thinly sliced
- ½ cup crumbled feta cheese
- $-\frac{1}{2}$ avocado, pitted and diced
- ¼ cup chopped, toasted pistachios
- ½ cup roasted chickpeas
- Fresh herbs, for garnish (basil, mint and/or chives)
- Sea salt and freshly ground pepper

DRESSING

- ¼ cup fresh basil or a mix of basil and mint
- 1 small garlic clove
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice, plus ½ teaspoon zest
- 1 tablespoon white wine vinegar
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, more as desired
- ¼ teaspoon sea salt

DIRECTIONS

- Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil and set a bowl of ice water nearby. Blanch the asparagus for about 1 minute, until tender but still bright green.
 Transfer to the ice water for 1 minute, then drain. Allow the asparagus to dry and transfer it back to the bowl and add the peas.
- 2. To make the dressing, us a food processor to pulse together the herbs, garlic, lemon juice, zest, vinegar, olive oil, and salt.
- 3. Add half of the dressing to the bowl with the asparagus and toss to coat. Season to taste with salt and pepper.
- 4. Assemble the salad. Arrange the salad greens on a platter, then layer the asparagus/pea mixture, the radishes, feta, avocado, pistachios, chickpeas, and herbs. Drizzle with remaining dressing, season to taste with more salt and pepper, and serve.
