About the Program

The Capital Health School of Radiologic Technology consists of a two year, full-time course of study beginning in the first week of July each year. The School accepts up to eight students per year, with a total enrollment of 16 students.

Eligibility for ARRT certification requires candidates to have earned an Associate degree or higher. The Capital Health School of RT offers two (2) tracks.

A certificate track is available for those students who have previously earned an Associate degree or higher.

A combined certificate and Associate degree track, established in articulation with Mercer County Community College, West Windsor, N.J. is offered for those students who must meet the ARRT Associate degree requirement.

Graduates who successfully complete the requirements of their chosen track are eligible to take the ARRT certification exam and pursue State of NJ licensure.

Our facilities include a dedicated classroom with audiovisual aids, practical phantoms and a full body skeleton. The Health Science library resources at Capital Health provides access to allied health literature and bibliographic databases, has eBook textbook collections, and subscribes to a number of online journals. In addition, materials are available through interlibrary loan. Clinical facilities include rotations at Capital Health – Hopewell, Capital Health Regional Medical Center, Capital Health – Hamilton, all located in Mercer County, NJ and St. Mary Medical Center, located in Langhorne, PA.



Admission Requirements

- High School or GED
- Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Achievement of a Reading score at or above the national mean is strongly recommended.
- Three letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts of ALL prior education (Foreign transcripts must be translated)
- Interview by program officials (by invitation only)
- Pre-requisite general education courses include college level:
 - English Composition I (3 credits)*
 - English Composition II and/or Oral Communication (3 credits)*
 - Algebra or Statistics (3 credits)*

*A minimum grade of “C” is required.

Candidates should be in good health & be of good moral character.

Students must provide their own health insurance while enrolled in the Program.

Prior to enrolling, all accepted students must undergo and successfully complete:

- Criminal background check
- Drug screening
- History and physical according to Capital Health policy

Tuition & Fees

All applicants are charged a \$50.00 non-refundable application fee. The cost for tuition & fees is estimated to be \$21,000 (subject to change) for the entire program and includes all direct expenses related to the program. A detailed tuition and fee schedule is available upon request.

The program participates in Title IV Financial Aid Programs: Pell Grants and Direct Loans.

Tuition refunds are available up to the 3rd week of the semester. No tuition will be refunded after the 3rd week. The tuition refund policy is available upon request.
